

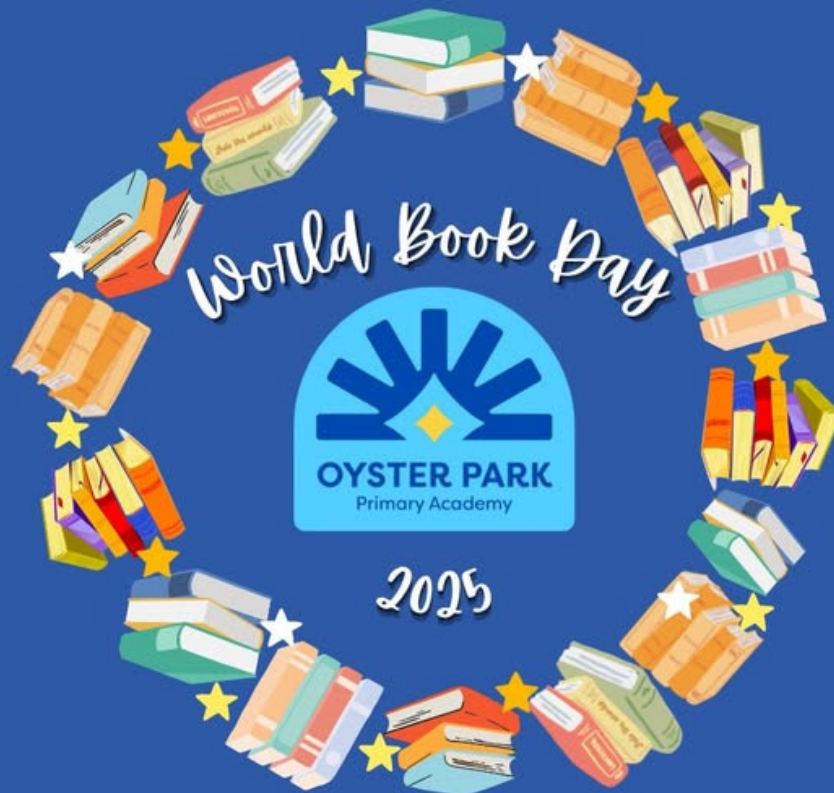

NEW MENU TASTER DAY

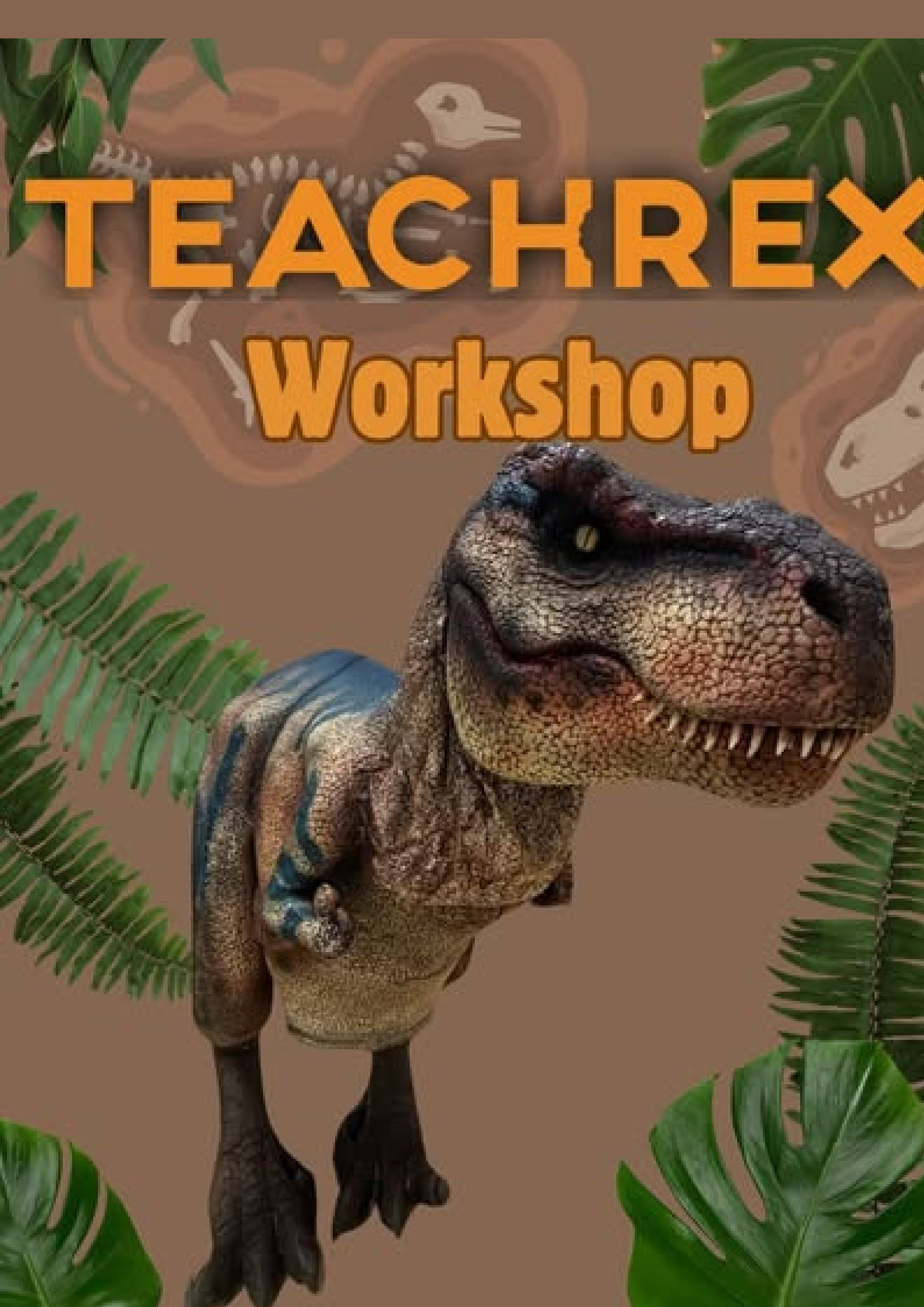




Some of our Pupils & Staff had a taster day on Friday for some of the new food that will be on our menus from April.

Miss Imeson & Mr Dixon have worked incredibly hard to create this new menu that our pupils are looking forward to eating.





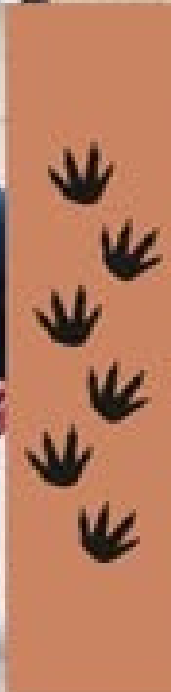
TEACHREX

They explored the landscapes upon which dinosaurs lived and learnt about their key features and diets.





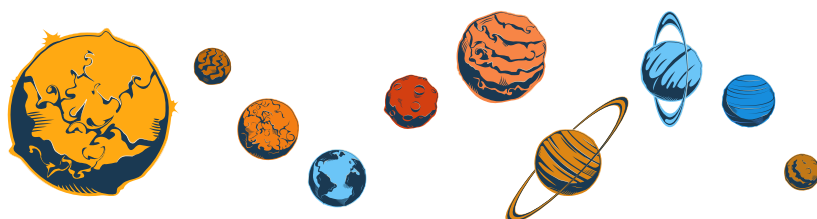
