Autumn 1: UFS



Communication & Language

The children will read to and be heard read every day. Initially, they will be encouraged to look carefully at the pictures in their books and discuss what they can see. The children will take part in circle time where they can share their own ideas and opinions with their friends. A range of books and reading resources will be available for the children to access each day covering a range of genres as well as daily story times to develop and nurture their love of reading.

Mathematical Development

This half term in Maths we will be focusing on accurate counting to 5 and extending to 10. We will begin to match numbers to quantities, as well as discussing and comparing objects. This will allow the children to develop their Mathematical language. The children will also be exploring the properties of 2D shapes.

<u>Key Vocabulary</u>

Literacy

This half term we will be starting daily Read, Write, Inc. sessions to develop our knowledge of letter sounds. We will develop our letter formation and practice writing our name. Within our Literacy lessons we will be developing our understanding of new vocabulary. We will develop our understanding of new vocabulary and retell simple stories.

Knowledge & Understanding of the

This half term we will be working scientifically to investigate freezing and melting and developing our scientific vocabulary. As Historians we will look at life in the past and comparing it to present. We will explore household items, jobs, school and food. As part of our learning, we will also investigate seasonal changes by exploring nature and going on a local nature walk. We will use our senses to describe the changes that we can see as we transition between the seasons.

Creative Curriculum

As part of our topic 'Let's Investigate!' we will begin by looking at how we can mix primary and secondary colours and create various shades and tints. We will be taking inspiration from the artist Piet Mondrian to create our own piece of art work developing our ability to use a variety of tools effectively.
