A brilliant day was had by all!





# **Nursery**Autumn Crafts















#### Social Skills – Bonfire Safety

as well as thinking about the precautions they could take themselves and with their grown-ups to help avoid any potential hazards.










#### Art & Design - The of different lines to create effects






# **English- Tom's voyage** along a river

In DT, the children have been preparing for and making a healthy wrap. In preparation, the pupils discussed the 5 food groups: protein, dairy, carbohydrates, fruits and vegetables, and fats and sugars. The pupils learnt how a combination of all these food groups forms a healthy and balanced diet.

After a taste test and their new knowledge of pupils then selected a range of ingredients to represent the different food groups to put in their wrap.

The pupils had a fantastic afternoon making their wraps. They could see how the different food groups created colour on their plate and how tasty it became with the range of meats, cheeses and vegetables.











# Social Skills – The Importance of good manners









#### Maths-Finding 100, 10 and 1 more or less

In Mathematics, the children have found 100, 10 and 1 more or less than a given number. At first, the children initially struggled with the concept, however once they used concrete items such as Base 10, they soon were able to answer the questions independently. The children said the Base 10 helped them to see the number change and this helped them answer the questions.







#### **Greek day- Past Productions Workshop**

This half term, Year 4 were visited by an Ancient Greek, from the Past Production Company, who hosted a day of

immersive workshops into the life of an Ancient Greek. Our pupils took part in their very own Olympic Games; they acted out the roles of various Greek Gods in a drama production and enjoyed a legendary tale into the history of the mighty Greek Gods!













In their French lessons the children in Year 4 have been practising using adjectives in French. They have learnt how to describe someone else's personality using third person pronouns and to know the difference between masculine and feminine adjectives. 






#### **Poet: Brian Bilston**

In celebration of National Poetry Day, the children in Year 5 have been studying the poem — Refugee by Brian Bilston. The poem is really interesting as you can read it forwards and backwards — this is called a palindrome poem. The poem shares a powerful statement about the mindset some people have about immigrants. We read the poem forwards and discussed our initial reaction and how the poem made us feel. We then read the poem backwards and discussed how our opinion of the poem changed.







#### **Anglo Saxons- Past Production Workshop**

This half term our Year 5 pupils were visited by an Anglo Saxon, from the Past Production Company, who hosted a day of immersive workshops into the life of an Anglo Saxon.

Our pupils made their own Anglo Saxon amulets using salt dough, they cracked codes using Anglo Saxon runes, they re-enacted the Story of Beowulf and wrote their very own mythical stories!



#### Let's Play some SQUASH!

Over the last eight weeks, 5F have had the opportunity to learn and apply new skills whilst being introduced to the racket sport of Squash at Pontefract Squash Club. 




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#### Virtual Author- OH MAYA GODS!


# Mathematics: Square and Cube Numbers

Year 6 have been drawing squares and making cubes to help them understand the concept of square and cube numbers. This enabled them to explain why some numbers are square numbers and some are cube. They could work systematically to find the next number in the sequence and make predictions.











#### The Fireworks Safety Code

- Only buy fireworks marked BS 7114.
- Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks.
- Keep fireworks in a closed box.
- Follow the instructions on each firework.
- · Light them at arm's length, using a taper.
- · Stand well back.
- Never go near a firework that has been lit.
   Even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode.
- Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them.
- · Always supervise children around fireworks.
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
- Never give sparklers to children under five.
- Keep pets indoors.
- Don't set off noisy fireworks late at night and never after 11pm.

#### **REMEMBER!**

Always let an adult handle the fireworksnever touch them.

Never go back to a lit firework.

Only hold one sparkler at a time and wear gloves. Put the sparkler in a bucket of sand or water.

Keep your pets inside.

Stand well back from the fireworks.

Always listen to an adult.

Never throw fireworks.







#### **MORE THAN CLUB!**

Last September the Northern Ambition Academy Trust Schools; Oyster Park Primary Academy, Airedale Junior School, Airedale Infant School and Airedale Academy launched our exciting attendance initiative to promote and reward good attendance. The 'More Than Club'.

The purpose of the More Than Club is to ensure the importance of good attendance is promoted to the whole school community. The focus of the initiative is to promote the benefits of attending school regularly rather than the consequences of non-attendance. Our ethos is 'We are more than just a school.'



#### Why is attending school important?

School is a child's first and most important job. They are learning about more than Mathematics or English. They are learning how to show up for school on time every day, so that when they leave education and get a job, they will know how to show up for work on time every day.

School helps children to develop important skills, knowledge and values that set them up for further learning and participation in their community.

Attending school regularly means children are more likely to achieve good GCSE results, continue to further education and find a good job.

Young people who are frequently absent from school are more likely to become involved in or be a victim of crime and anti-social behaviour.

The More Than Club

The More Than Club will celebrate good attendance for individual pupils, classes and year groups.

If a child's attendance is above:

98% at the end of the Autumn Term – Hot Dog Party

97% at the end of Spring term – Pizza Party

96% at the end of Summer Term- Ice Cream Parlor

They will join the More Than Club and enjoy a fantastic reward for example a pizza party.

Each half term the class in EYFS, Key Stage 1, Lower Key Stage 2 and Upper Key Stage 2 with the most improved attendance will enjoy a class celebration.

We know sometimes pupils find attending school difficult. If an adult in school notices a pupil has worked hard to improve their attendance, they will nominate you for the attendance superstar award.
