Autumn 1: Nursery



Communication & Language

This term to support children's listening and attention skills, we will be encouraging them to focus upon their self-selected or group activities for increasing periods of time. To develop children's speech, we are always encouraging children to talk about a range of topics for example their interests, home life and favourite foods. We also encourage children to use simple sentences when communicating with others.

Mathematical Development

This term we will begin by looking at counting in everyday contexts, for example, counting how many children are here today, how many pieces of fruit we have, how many milk cartoons are left. We will also be studying a number in depth looking at how the number is represented in a range of ways and having a go at mark making the numeral. We will also be looking at comparing sizes using vocabulary such as big and small.

PSED

This term we will be helping the children become familiar with the Nursery environment, routines and expectations. We will be encouraging children to play alongside others through a range of games and social group activities. The children will also be developing their understanding of our 'Show Me 5' carpet rules, this includes: eyes looking at the teacher, lips closed, hands on knees, feet still and listening ears.

Literacy

During phonics sessions we will be providing the children with a range of activities to support them in identifying sounds which are the same or different in the environment. This will include listening walks, exploring musical instruments and the sounds they make as well as everyday objects.

We will be reading a range of books linked to our topic but we will also be reading a range of books at the end of each day with a focus book per week. The children will be able to develop a greater understanding and comprehension around the book as well as recalling key parts of the story. We will be exploring language and understanding the meaning of new words we have found.

Knowledge & Understanding of the World

In our investigation area we will be exploring all about our bodies. We will be learning about our different body parts as well as looking at bones, muscles and organs which make up our bodies. The children will also be learning about the different senses that we use and why each one is important.

We will start to explore the changing seasons and learn all about Autumn. The children will have chance to observe, record and comment on the days weather.
