

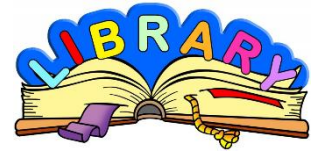

This week the children in Year 1 and 2 were guests of Airedale Library. The children were invited to an afternoon spent in the community facility. Library staff discussed the importance of reading and the children found out that they were eligible to a FREE library card when joining. Staff described all of the different genres and types of books and then they allowed our children to browse all of the books available. It was fantastic to see that there was a real sense of excitement with the array of different choices; the children have a real passion for stories. The library staff commented on the excellent behaviour and inquisitive questions that the children put to them and they assured the children that they were welcome to join at any time. We do, however, emphasise the importance of wider reading out of school to excite and inspire our children's imaginations.
