
Deacon Sharon – Morals


Assembly: Anti Bullying Ambassador Assembly

Ancient Egyptian Workshop

As part of the Land of the Pharaohs topic, Year 3 had an exciting visit from the Pharaoh Akhenaten. The children participated in a workshop where they explored the tomb of Tutankhamun, handled different artefacts and produced dramas about farming, Gods, scribes and mummification. The children had the opportunity to dress up in the different roles of Egyptian society. Following this, the children had the chance to produce their own cartouche using hieroglyphics and created a picture of Tutankhamun using different sketching techniques.
