### Year 5 Past Productions - Ancient Greeks Workshop

As part of their 'Into the Labyrinth' topic, Year 5 had a fantastic day on Monday when they took part in a workshop delivered by Past Productions, based on their History topic the Ancient Greeks. During the day, the children created and performed their own myths using a variety of props and historical costumes. In addition to this, the children learned about democracy and even voted in the same way the Ancient Greeks did. The children thoroughly enjoyed the day and learned many new interesting facts.

### Year 1, Visit - The Deep

On Monday, the children and staff in Year 1 visited the Deep in Hull as part of their topic 'Under the sea'. Whilst there, they enjoyed exploring the different exhibits including the breathtaking coral reef at the Lagoon, the interesting animals in the Slime exhibit, and creatures of the Amazon in the Flooded Forest.



The children particularly enjoyed looking at the different colourful marine animals, especially the rays and sharks in the Endless Ocean exhibit! During the day the children took part in a special workshop, where they learnt what animals need in order to stay alive and looked at the similarities between land and marine animals.



### Taking Science Outdoors!

On Monday, Year 4 enjoyed taking their Science learning outdoors! The children went to investigate how the environments conditions can affect the process of evaporation. The children created their own puddles and observed the changes that occurred. They measured what was happening in relation to the perimeter and diameter of the puddles. The children drew chalk lines around the puddle every 10 minutes, using a stopwatch to time equal intervals and to ensure accuracy in recordings. The children were then able to explain, using key scientific vocabulary that evaporation had taken place due to weather conditions.
