

## English Challenges

### Fairy Tales



- Read a range of traditional tales.
- Choose your favourite character from the traditional tales that you read. Write a character description. Explain what makes them so special using adjectives and suffix words.
- Invent your own version of a traditional tale. Draw an action story map to help you plan your story. You could change the names of the characters or change their personalities. Use traditional story language when you write your story.
- Practise saying the alphabet. Write the letters in order using capital letters and lower case letters.
- Go on a scavenger hunt and find an object that starts with A. Can you find an object for every letter of the alphabet?

## Mathematics Challenges


- Practise counting, reading and writing numbers to 100 forwards and backwards.
- Learn to write the numbers 0-20 in words.
- Learn to make equal groups of objects, use your toys to help you, in preparation for learning about multiplication.
- Practise sharing objects equally between people. You could share your sweets equally or your toys with your family.
- Learn to tell the time to the half hour.
- Search for numbers around your house. Can you find 1 more and 1 less than the numbers that you find?

## Science Challenges



- Research trees. Find out the names for the parts of the tree. What is a deciduous tree? What is an evergreen tree? Create a fact file to show everything you have learnt.
- Use your sketching skills to sketch a tree. Label the different parts. Sketch what a deciduous tree looks like in the different seasons.
- Why are trees important for humans and our planet? Create a poster explaining why we should protect trees.

## History Challenge



- Who was William the Conqueror? Research who he was and why he was important in British History.
- Research other famous British Kings and Queens. Can you order their reigns in chronological order and create a time line?
- Prince Charles will be our next king. Research what happened when he officially became the Prince of Wales in 1969 at Carnarvon Castle.
- Use the vocabulary past, present and future to describe your own life.

## Geography Challenge



- Sketch the human and physical features that you can find in coastal areas and label them.
- Write a list of features that can be found in a coastal area and a list of features that are found in the local area. Are there any features that can be found in both places?
- Write a list of animals that can be found near the Equator and a list of animals that can be found near the North and South Poles.

## General Knowledge Challenge



- What is the tallest mountain in the world? Create a Paper Mache model of it.
- What is the biggest animal in the ocean? What is the fastest animal on land? Research and record your findings. Can you write your own questions to answer?
- What are the Olympic Games? Watch <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tpWna2NC94> to be inspired. Create your own Olympic mascot.
- Can you write a list of all of the sports that feature in the Olympic Games? Are there any other sports that you think should be included?

## Creative Challenge



- Write your own song. Create your own pulse and record your performance.
- Research different genres of music. What is your favourite? Learn a song from your favourite style of music.
- Invent a magical place where you would like to live. Use sketches, drawings and paintings to show what it would look like. Sketch a map with a key to show the features that it will have. Use your descriptive language to describe what it would be like to live there.
- Using different objects and paint create a picture using different textures.
