

### English Challenges



- With an adult plant a seed. Write a set of instructions to help someone else plant a seed. Use time words to help you such as first, then and next.
- Write a poem about the weather or the seasons. Use describing words to make it interesting.
- Write a letter to your teacher. Tell them all the things that you have done whilst you have been at home. Don't forget to ask your teacher what they have done.
- Read a story that you enjoy. Write a list of all the adjectives that the author has used. Can you use the adjectives in sentences of your own?

### ICT Challenges

- Record yourself, on a device, retelling your favourite story.



- Have an ICT hunt in your house. How many different electronic devices can you find? Write them down in a list.
- Create your own game that you would include on an iPad. Describe what you would need to do and draw pictures to show what it would look like.

### Mathematics Challenges

- Learn to tell the time to the o'clock with your family.
- Create your own pretend shop. Give the items a price and learn what each coin looks like.



- Make a robot using recycled materials. Choose items that are 3D shapes. Can you use a cube, cuboid and cylinder?
- Go on a shape hunt around your house and garden and write a list of the different objects that you can find that are 2D or 3D shapes.
- Write some addition and subtraction number sentences and challenge your grown ups to solve them. Make sure their answers are correct.

### Science Challenges



- Using what you know about clouds, go cloud spotting. Can you see a cumulus (big, white and fluffy), cirrus (long, wispy and high in the sky) or stratus (dark and grey) cloud? Record how many you can see.
- Keep a weather diary. Record each day what the weather is like. Use a bottle to make a rain gauge and record how much rain there has been.
- Record your own weather forecast!

## History Challenge



- Research Pontefract castle. Who lived there? Who built the castle? How old is it? What interesting facts can you find out about it?
- Create your own family tree.



- What is a Coat of Arms? Create your own family Coat of Arms. Make sure that it shows all the things that are special about your family.

## General Knowledge Challenge




- What is a 'Coronation'? Research and record your findings.
- Who will become King or Queen next? How are they connected to Queen Elizabeth II?
- What is VE day and why did we commemorate it? Make a poster explaining what you know?
- Create a fact file about something that you find interesting. It could be about the planets, an animal, dinosaurs or anything that you like. Write down as much information as you can.

## Geography Challenge



- Sketch the outline of the United Kingdom. Using your knowledge can you label the four countries of the United Kingdom and the seas that surround them.
- Go on a walk in the local area or look from your garden. What human features (shops, houses, bus stops) and physical features (hills, rivers, woodland) can you see? Write a list of them and then sketch a map of where they are located.

## Creative Challenge



- Create a Union flag by using collage materials.
- Research a famous artist. Create a fact file about them and create a piece of art inspired by their artwork.



- Create a musical instrument using recycled materials that you have at home.
- Use different media or sketching techniques to draw some illustrations for your favourite story or a story that you have written.
