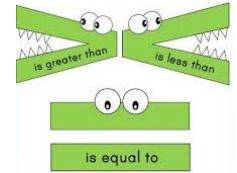
- Read the digraphs and think of a word that includes each sound. Write a sentence using the words.

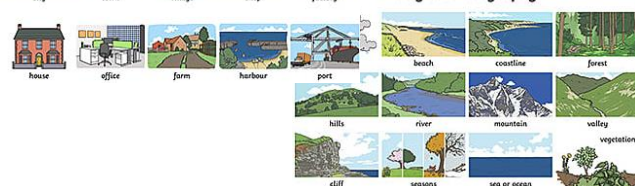
### Geography Challenge
