

English Challenges

- You wake up in a world where all your childhood drawings come to life. Tell the story.
- Look at the image - Write a conversation between the penguin and the woman. Remember your punctuation.



- A new car has just been invented. 'The spider car'. Create an advert for the new car.



- Watch the video clip <https://www.literacyshed.com/diving-giraffes.html>. Write a news report about the event.
- Watch a film of your choice and write a film review.

ICT Challenges

- Make a PowerPoint all about Spain.
- Create a poster about staying safe online.
- Create a maze and create an algorithm for someone to get through the maze
- Complete a photo challenge. Find a photo for each letter of your name and take a picture of it.
- Record an exciting event that has happened. Create a video news report reporting the event.

Mathematics Challenges

- Have a times table battle with someone else in your house.
- Go on a nature hunt. See how many different types of bugs you can find. Record your findings in a table and create a bar chart representing your data.
- Using natural objects from your garden, can you make different 2D shapes? Can you make different triangles using twigs? What natural objects could you use to create a pentagon?
- Find a variety of sticks and break them into halves and quarters etc. Create your very own fraction wall.
- Using different objects from your food cupboard, estimate the different weights. See if you were close by looking at the labels.

Science Challenges

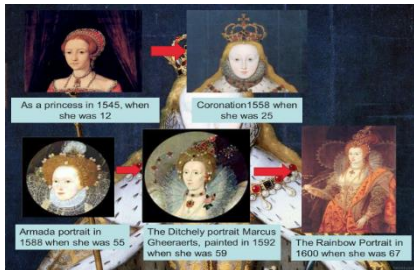
- Watch Blue Planet: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TPYxbMvgR30&feature=youtu.be> to discover what lives in the ocean. Create a fact file about the different sea creatures.
- Create your own volcano using only the following equipment: a bottle, vinegar and bicarbonate of soda (red food colouring if available). Observe and record what happens.
- Create a habitat using resources in your garden for a small creature. See the example below.





- Use building blocks to make shapes you can draw around. How does the shadow change if you rotate the block? Is the shadow different at different times of day?

History Challenge

- Interview an older member of your family to see how times have changed over time and what things are the same.
- Create a poster about who was to blame for the sinking of the Titanic (you will have to think back to your prior learning).
- Research information about the Spanish Armada and create your own knowledge organiser. You may find the link below useful

- Look at the picture of Queen Elizabeth I. Write a paragraph explaining why you think they painted her to look so young.





Creative Challenge

- A new area of land has been discovered in Spain. You are new in charge of designing a new city in Spain. First, make a plan of what to include. Then detail why tourists should visit.
- Create instruments from household items and create a family band.
- Create your own exercise routine for other people to follow. Make sure you add images and instructions so that it is easy to follow. 
- Using a piece of A4 paper and a lollipop stick, create your very own Spanish fan. Decorate this using Spanish colours. See example. 
- Using different colours and patterns create your own animal mosaic art inspired by Antoni Gaudi. See the examples below for some ideas.

Geography Challenge

- Investigate what the weather/climate is like in Spain. Create your own weather report based on the information that you find.
- Create your own song to remember the 7 continents like the one below we listened to in class

- Create a mnemonic to remember the order of the 5 oceans (Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Southern, Arctic).
- Research the Pyrenees mountains. Create a fact file with the information that you find.
- Create a map of your street. Create a key to show what the symbols on your map represent.
- Research a famous landmark in Spain and think of an interesting way that you could present your information to others.
- Create your own travel guide for Spain.

Art & Design Challenge

- Sketch a picture of the bull. 
- Create an arena where the bull fights would usually take place using Lego blocks, lollipop sticks or playdoh.
- Look in a mirror and draw a self portrait of your face.
- Create an animal collage out of leaves and twigs from your garden. 
- Follow the step-by-step guide on how to draw a minotaur. See the example.



General Knowledge Challenge

- List as many places as you can in Europe.
- Learn how to count to 10 in French (Zéro, un, deux, trois, quatre, cinq, six, sept, huit, neuf, dix). Compare them with the Spanish numbers from last time.
- Create a quiz based on the countries flags within Europe.
- Make a list of all the Olympic Sports.

Cultural Capital Challenge

- Learn yourself some new Spanish Greetings:
Hola- Hello
Adiós. - Goodbye
Buenos días. Good morning.
Buenas tardes. Good afternoon.
Buenas noches. Good evening
- Write a thank you letter to someone who you appreciate to show how grateful you are. You could post it to them or put a stamp on an addressed envelope and send it.
- Look at the different foods in your cupboards. Look at the labels. Do they all come from the same place? Which places do they come from? Make a list of the food name and where it comes from.
